

NEW PROJECT: KITCHEN OF LOVE PROVIDES MEALS FOR MARGINALISED **IN KOREA**

The Order of Malta Korea started its new project for the homeless at Caritas 'Kitchen of Love' where a nutritious meal for 90 marginalised neighbours including homeless, disabled and underfed seniors are served.

The kitchen had been shut down for several weeks due to the COVID-19 pandemic, however it reopened in April under strict supervision for safety. Twelve members and volunteers worked in a renovated kitchen now fully equipped with professional facilities, thanks to a generous donation by Martha Kiok Jung.

The Kitchen of Love will run four times a month regularly on scheduled dates

MEDICAL CLINIC, TIMOR-LESTE -**PLANNING FOR LONG-TERM**

The Order of Malta medical clinic in Dili continues to provide world class medical treatment to the people of Timor-Leste. However the funding for this facility has been dependent on one-off grants and

large gifts from individual donors.

SUSTAINABILITY

A major goal for the clinic in 2020 is to increase the clinic's capabilities to include radiology and pathology services and offer an expanded service to expatriates and corporate clients. The intention is that these fee-earning medical activities would not only pay for the running of the 'free' clinic but would also enable it to expand its services beyond the clinic walls and reach out to the poor and sick in their homes and communities

To enable this, there is a need to purchase the equipment and employ new medical staff, so that resources are not taken away from the poor.

We are seeking donors able to make large gifts that will enable the clinic to be sustainable for years to come. These donations will benefit thousands of poor and sick in Timor-Leste.

- * \$15,000 would pay the annual salary of a Timorese doctor
- * \$35,000 equipment for x-ray services
- * \$50,000 equipment for pathology services







ORDER OF **MALTA ASIA PACIFIC** COVID-19 **RESPONSE**

The Order of Malta has been committed to serving the sick and poor for over 900 years. In this time, we have confronted diseases, natural disasters and wars. Today in all 120 countries we operate in, we fight Coronavirus.



In addition to distributing 6,000 Coats for the Homeless across every State and territory in Australia, our members and volunteers have also been providing hygiene packs to the homeless to help protect them during the pandemic.

The packs, containing facemasks, antibacterial wipes and personal items both protect and limit the transmission of Coronavirus amongst the homeless and wider community.

Food hampers for foreign students in Tasmania

In Tasmania, members have assisted foreign students who do not qualify for support from either the Commonwealth or State governments, by providing emergency food hampers. Many have lost their student jobs necessary to pay for their rent, food, tuition, transport and are unable to fly home during the pandemic.



Members and volunteers of the Order of Malta Korea put together an emergency relief project to assist underfed children, foreign workers and refugees amidst the COVID-19 outbreak.



The relief boxes, full of packaged food and personal hygiene products, were distributed in Daegu, Incheon and Seoul and were gratefully received, especially when many free meal services have had to temporarily suspend service during the pandemic.

Thermometers for Mae Sariang refugee camp and food parcels for vulnerable in Thailand

The Order of Malta Thailand purchased and donated nine infrared thermometers for Malteser International refugee camp at Mae Sariang, North of Thailand.

Malteser International is using the infrared thermometers to screen visitors as a measure to prevent the spreading of COVID-19 into the camp which is taking care of about 20,000 refugees.

They have also provided food bags to vulnerable households, including refugee families, the elderly, single parents and large families. Children in these homes were also gifted drawing books and colorful pencils to occupy their time during lockdown.

Food parcel deliveries in New Zealand

Members and volunteers in New Zealand assisted St Vincent de Paul with delivery of food parcels following a 400% rise in requests for their foodbank services following the disruption caused by COVID-19.

Assistance to senior Members

Regional Hospitallers contacted senior members offering assistance and support when social restrictions were introduced.




A small group of members gathered to assemble the homeless hygiene packs in South Melbourne. The operation was controlled with social distancing, masks and hand sanitiser.

UPDATE: BUSHFIRE RESPONSE

Following the Order of Malta's initial disaster response of providing food and petrol vouchers to bushfire victims, the Order's efforts are now focused on supporting the recovery with small teams visiting families and individuals that have been identified as high risk during this traumatic experience. Parish priests will be supporting and directing our efforts to ensure we can make the most impact through personal interaction, listening to those traumatised and ministering to their individual needs.

Amongst the many vulnerable people who have been hard hit by the effects of the lockdown, were the patients at the Order of Malta's care facility in Mandeni, the Brotherhood of Blessed Gérard.

The facility serves the poorest of the poor, many of them affected by HIV-Aids, receive life-saving medicine and food. The organisation also runs an orphanage, a hospice and a clinic for malnourished children.

With the worsening pandemic, Father Gérard Lagleder OSB, the facility's founder and President, reported seeing many people on the brink of starvation. They responded by providing life-saving food packages to 300 vulnerable families.

Each food parcel lasted one month for a family of two or three people.

Extracts from a letter from one of our recipients of the food vouchers after their property was completely destroyed by bushfires on the 31 December.

"I write to thank your organisation most sincerely for your caring support of us at this time. Rest assured your generosity has helped us to sit back a moment and 'take stock', as it were and not have to worry quite so much about our immediate financial situation.

I applaud the worthy work that the Order of Malta does most earnestly.

But demand for these parcels is expected to rise significantly and donations to the facility had fallen dramatically during the pandemic.

Consequently, the Australian Association provided a contribution of \$5,000 to assist with the growing demand at the facility during these unprecedented times. This will feed 500 people for a month.

TO REMOTE VILLAGES IN NORTH EAST THAILAND

In March, the Order of Malta Thailand delivered 20 wheelchairs to remote villages.

The Wheelchair Project has been running annually since 2016. The wheelchairs are purchased and distributed to the sick and poor, many living in dire poverty. The wheelchairs provide the recipients with greater independence as they are otherwise usually reliant on family to move from their beds and around their homes.
